

# **New Jersey 4-H Connections Project**

Activity # 7 - This is Me (Creative Arts)



**Introduction:** You will create a "This is Me" painting or drawing on posterboard or canvas using markers or paints. Your picture will showcase what you are most proud of and/or highlight your interests.

### Supplies Needed:

Experiment Station

- Tempera paint and brush or markers
- Posterboard or Canvas board
- Pencil
- One piece of plain scrap paper
- Newspaper or plastic to cover table (if using paints)
- Cup for water (if using paints)
- Paper towel to clean and dry paint brush (if using paint)

#### Instructions:

- 1. Gather your supplies.
- 2. Cover the area you will be working on with newspaper or plastic to avoid getting paint or marker on your table.
- 3. On a piece of scrap paper, sketch your ideas for your "This is Me" drawing. Your drawing can be a picture of what you are most proud of and/or pictures of things you like to do. You can add words to describe things, if you wish.
- 4. Use paints or markers to create your drawing on a piece of posterboard or on a canvas board.
- 5. Show your "This is Me" drawing to your family members and tell them what you are most proud of and why.
