

N. J. 4-H Equine Arts Show

To be held in Conjunction with the N.J. State 4-H Horse Bowl Contest on
Saturday Feb. 25, 2017

Open to any 4-H member grades 4 to 13

Any type of art, craft, or photo may be entered as long as it has an
equine theme. Pre-registration must be received by February 17th.

Entries must be received by 10 a. m. on the day of the show.

Rules

1. This event is open to all New Jersey 4-H club members (Grades 4-13). Grade is determined by the grade in which the member is enrolled the September prior to the event. ***PARTICIPANTS DO NOT NEED TO BE 4-H HORSE CLUB MEMBER, just a registered 4-H club member as of January 1, 2017.***
2. Junior Exhibitors are Grades 4-8, Senior Exhibitors are Grades 9-13. There is no Cloverbud division.
3. Each county is allowed to enter an unlimited number of exhibitors. Each exhibitor may enter up to 5 of each type of item (i.e. 5 paintings, 5 color drawings, 5 black and white drawings, 5 crafts, 5 color photos, 5 black and white photos, etc.)
- 3a. **ITEMS PREVIOUSLY ENTERED IN THIS SHOW MAY NOT BE ENTERED AGAIN**
4. Contestants must be enrolled in a 4-H Club during the current year, in the county they are representing and be a club "Member in Good Standing." Agent/staff person signature is required for this verification.
5. All exhibits must be original artwork done by the 4-H member. All entries must follow a horse theme, and not have been previously entered in this art show. Photographs must be taken **BY** the 4-H Member submitting them. School art projects are acceptable. Digital photography is welcome. Computer/digital enhancements are allowed but the member should list what was done if it was more than cropping and basic color, contrast adjustments, etc.
6. Each item must be accompanied by a 3 x 5 card, attached to the back or bottom of the artwork and contain the following information: Name of 4-H'er & County, Phone Number and Grade, Name/title of artwork, Division (Junior or Senior)
- 6a. **Fill out a score sheet** for each item and **submit them together**. The member must fill out the top part. (To make it easier fill out the member information section, then make copies).
7. Entries will be divided into classes according to the entries received. Acceptable items include paintings, drawings, ceramics, repainted model horses, sculptures, horse related sewing projects, crafts, photographs, collages, mixed media, painted horse shoes, etc.
8. Awards - There will be ribbons for 1st - 3rd place in each class, and rosettes or other awards for the Champion in each Division.
9. The 4-H'er does not have to be present to participate. Entries may be brought and picked up by another person from the county. Please make sure info cards are complete.
10. **All artwork must be picked up before the awards ceremony for Horse Bowl (but not before 3 p.m.)**
ANY ARTWORK NOT PICKED UP WILL NOT BE RETURNED AFTER THE SHOW.
11. All entries will be photographed and entered into *Horse News* equine art contest. For those submitting digital photos please also e-mail the photos to horsenews@hcdemocrat.com

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New Jersey 4-H Code of Conduct



The primary purpose of the New Jersey 4-H Code of Conduct is to ensure the safety and well-being of all participants at 4-H sponsored events and activities. It applies to all participants, with participants defined as 4-H members, their parents, and volunteers.

As a participant in the 4-H program, I will:

- **Conduct myself in a courteous manner and treat members, parents, 4-H volunteers, Extension staff, judges and others with respect. Appropriate language and behavior are expected at all times.**
- **Respect and adhere to the rules and guidelines of the 4-H program including all those specific to a 4-H event or activity.**
- **Uphold an individual's right to dignity by supporting an environment of inclusion which welcomes involvement of participants from all backgrounds.**
- **Accept supervision and support from county and state 4-H staff while participating in the 4-H program. This includes acceptance of supervision and support from appointed 4-H volunteers coordinating 4-H events and activities.**
- **Obey local, state and federal laws.**

Participants who fail to adhere to the New Jersey 4-H Code of Conduct are subject to a range of disciplinary actions. Such actions will be taken in compliance with the New Jersey 4-H Discipline Policy and Procedure. When appropriate, immediate corrective action will be taken at the 4-H event to ensure the safety and welfare of all participants.

I understand if I fail to adhere to the above Code of Conduct, I will be subject to disciplinary action and potentially prohibited from attending and participating in the New Jersey 4-H Youth Development program.
