The NJ 4-H goLEAD Youth Leadership Institute will provide an opportunity for middle school age youth to develop leadership and community service knowledge and skills. The theme this year is goLEAD for 4E and the workshops and guest speakers will focus on environmental topics.

goLEAD (generationOn Leadership, Education, and Development) is an innovative approach to equip middle and high school aged youth with invaluable 21st century skills that will allow them to change themselves and the world through service and is a program of Generation On, a global youth service movement igniting the power of all kids to make their mark on the world.
